



Loading and playing text converted MP3 files:

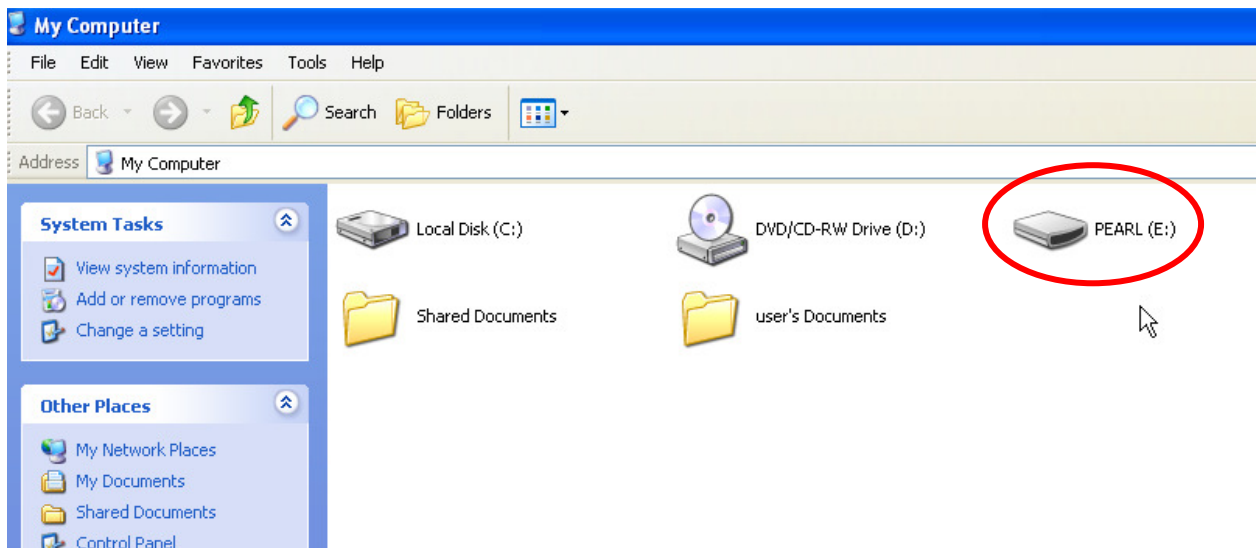
A Beginners Tutorial:

What you need first:

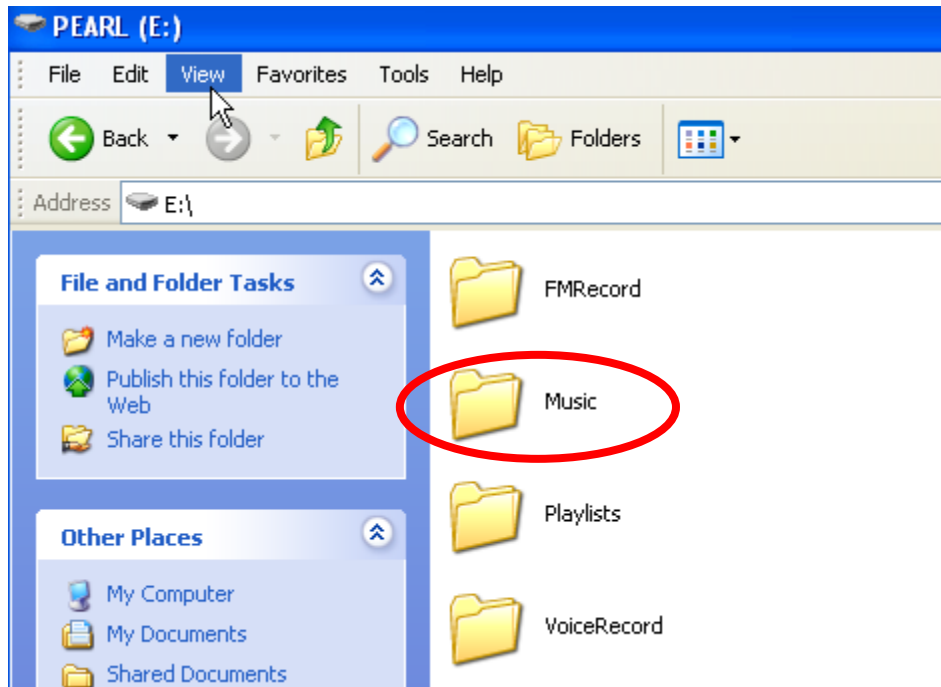
1. An MP3 Player - flash drive style preferred.
2. A computer with Windows Media Player for internal playing.

What you do:

1. Plug the USB of the MP3 player into the USB port on the computer.
2. Allow a minute for the computer to recognize the device. The first time you put it in it will recognize, load and prepare the software and tell you when the device is ready.
3. Double-click My Computer and you should see a new drive E: icon. I have a Pearl MP3 player USB in so it says "Pearl". Yours might say something different. Also, if you have other external USB memory devices inserted, the one you are looking for might be "F". See below:



4. Double-click to open the external drive and you should see a set of folders. There should be one for each type of media, i.e. voice recording, music, audiobooks, radio recordings, etc. You will want to open a folder to put your ebook text recordings in. On the Pearl, I use the "Music" folder.



5. Open the folder you want to use to place your ebook text recording files into, then reduce that window on your desktop. Open the folder where you have the Mp3 files located that you want to transfer, then click, hold and drag each one over to the MP3 player folder you have opened. A bar will show, filling as it writes each file to the player.
6. Congratulations! You have put your files on the player. Now you can follow your MP3 player directions on how to listen to your files.

Please Note:

If your player is a different kind and this tutorial doesn't work to help you on how to do file transfers for your player, then consult the manual that came with your player for directions on how to load files.
